Introduction

Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation (PaTCoF) was established vide G.O (MS) No.87/2013/F&WLD dated 20.09.2013 and as per Section 38 X of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, in observance of the procedures laid down in Notification No. S.O.1008 (E) dated 22.06.2007 of Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India.

Government of Kerala vide G.O (Rt) No.473/2013/F&WLD dated 22.11.2013 have also approved the Regulations of the Foundation. Subsequently, the Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation was registered by the Board of Trustees under the Charitable and Religious Trust Act, 1920 on 6th January 2014 with an aim to facilitate and support the Parambikulam Tiger Reserve Management for the conservation of Tiger and Biodiversity, through multi stake holder participation as per approved Tiger Conservation Plan and to support similar initiatives in the adjoining landscapes.

Vide G.O (MS) No.38/2014/F&WLD dated 22.04.2014, Government of Kerala has also authorized PaTCoF to augment and mobilize financial resources including recycling of entry and such other fees received in Parambikulam Tiger Reserve to foster stakeholder development and eco-tourism in accordance with the provisions of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 and also in observance of provisions contained in G.O (MS) No.87/2013/F&WLD dated 20.09.2013. Accordingly, a Bank Account (No.33824089274) with State Bank of India at Anamalai Branch was opened in the name of Secretary, Executive Committee (Deputy Director, Parambikulam Tiger Reserve) of the Foundation. From 03.05.2014 onwards, the receipts from the Tiger Reserve are being collected in this Account.

Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation has completed 9 years with commendable activities for achieving the intended objectives.

1. Activities of the Foundation

1.1. Administration

During the reporting period, one meeting of the Governing Body (9th meeting held on 14th October 2022) and three meetings of the Executive Committee (31th, 32nd and 33rd meetings held on 01/07/2022, 06/09/2022, and 05/11/2022 respectively were held).

1.1.2. Administrative Support

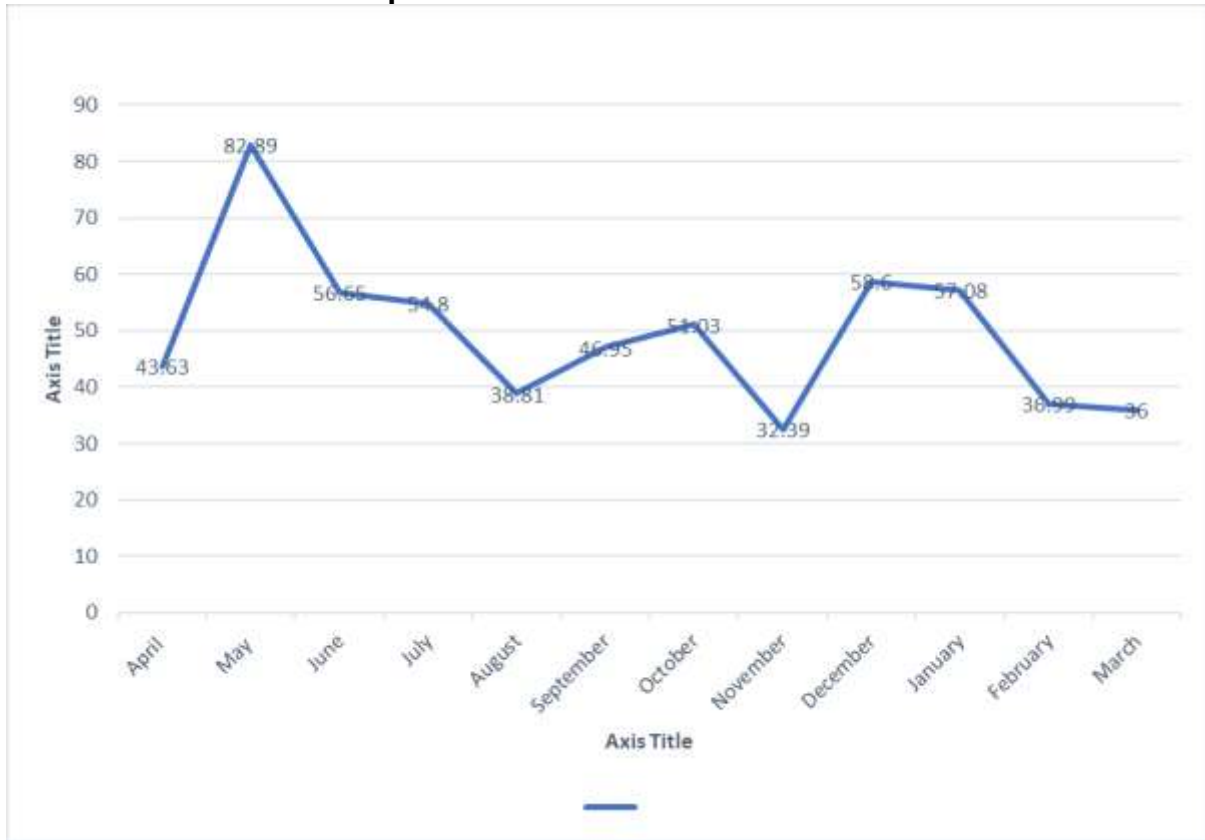
PaTCoF provided administrative support to the management of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve in the form of recoupable advances and technical inputs.

1.2. Resource Mobilization

Vide G.O (MS) No.38/2014/F&WLD dated 22.04.2014, Government of Kerala has also authorized PaTCoF to augment and mobilize financial resources including recycling of entry and such other fees received in Parambikulam Tiger Reserve to foster stakeholder development and eco-tourism in accordance with the provisions of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 and also in observance of provisions contained in G.O (MS) No.87/2013/F&WLD dated 20.09.2013. Accordingly, a Bank Account (No.33824089274) with State Bank of India at Anamalai Branch was opened in the name of Secretary, Executive Committee (Deputy Director, Parambikulam Tiger Reserve) of the Foundation. From 03.05.2014 onwards, the receipts from the Tiger Reserve are being collected in this Account.

During the reporting year, Foundation had received a total amount of Rs.6,56,56,963/- by way of entry fees, Ecotourism, Sale of products through Ecoshops and sale of Coir Root trainers, Bank Interest etc and expended Rs.5,74,48,413/- for various activities in Annual Plan of Operations 2021-22 of PaTCoF approved in the 8th Governing body.

2. Improved PA Management

As part of the habitat improvement activities and monitoring of wildlife and its habitats in Parambikulam Tiger Reserve, the Foundation has assisted technically and financially the following activity.

2.1 Population Estimation and monitoring of Tigers

The Phase IV Tiger Monitoring protocol of NTCA contains five components. a) Maintaining daily patrolling log; b) Carrying out beat wise monitoring sign encounters twice a year; c) Recording from PiP; d) Obtaining minimum tiger number using cameratraps; e) Obtaining tiger numbers using camera traps.

This exercise was carried out from December 2022 to April 2023 in the core and buffer of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. All the field staff and watchers along with the tiger monitoring team participated in this camera trapping exercise. Camera traps were deployed in 237 locations in Parambikulam. Around 4,23,000 images were recorded and 1652 tiger images were extracted from this. These tiger images were processed and 35 individual tigers were identified. Density was estimated using SPACECAP software and the estimated density was 2.40 individuals/100 sq.km.



2.2. Bird Survey

Bird survey was conducted from February 23-26 in Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. The survey was organised by Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation along with Trivandrum Natural History Society. Volunteers from different parts of Kerala were invited to lead the survey. 15 camps, representing all vegetation types in the reserve were selected for the survey. A team of five or six members (Two or three bird watchers, one forest staff and two watchers). Were sent to each camp. Different transects were assigned to all the teams for each day. Datasheets were provided to each team for data collection. Every bird sighting was

recorded in the datasheet along with necessary supporting data, apart from that they were also able to record the sighting of other species like amphibians, Reptiles, Butterflies etc. The survey teams were able to identify 290 species of Birds, 209 species of Butterflies, 30 species of Odonates, 12 species of reptiles and six species of amphibians.



2.3. Survey of Rare, Endangered and threatened flora of Parambikulam

An initiative to record the Rare, Endangered and threatened flora of Parambikulam was organised by Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation along with Kerala Forest Research Institute, Peechi. An MoU was signed by both parties for the successful completion of the work. The team was led by Dr. P.Sujanapal, Principal Scientist, KFRI. All the necessary support was provided by the PaTCoF during the field visit. Several rare species of plants were recorded during the field visit. The project was not yet completed.



3. Capacity Building and Training Programmes

Regularly training /capacity building programmes are conducted by PaTCoF. Programmes conducted during the reporting period are given in the table below.

3.1. Skill Development Training on culinary

Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation in association with AIFRHM Thrissur organised five-day skill development training from June 20 to 24 to improve the cooking skills of the cafe & canteen staff of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. During the training Kerala sadya dishes, Biryani, Chicken dishes, how to grind sambar powder, and garam masala, to make different types of juice and pickles by using Mango, Gooseberry and Bamboo shoot were taught. Food providing teams of Tented Niche, Honey Comb, Vengoli cafe, Kannimara Cafe, Parambriyar Cafe, and members of Amla Unit, and EDC members are participated in the training session.



3.2. Training to Handle Parambikulam Tiger Reserve's Mobile Application

PaTCoF developed and launched a mobile application with the support of Leopard Tech Labs Pvt. Ltd for easy management of ecotourism activities of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. The application includes the attendance of the staff, stock management, check post entry and IB booking. A training was given to the staff of ecotourism about the use of mobile applications at study hall on February 16, 2023 by Leopard Tech Labs Pvt. Ltd.



3.3. Thumbimaholsavam 2022 at Parambikulam Tiger Reserve

A two day seminar on conservation of Odonates named “Thumbimaholsavam 2022” was organized by PaTCoF in association with WWF India and Society for Odonates Studies, Kottayam on December 2 & 3,2022 at Tiger hall, Parambikulam.

Around 40 frontline staff, Antipoaching watchers, Naturalists and students from Govt. Tribal Welfare School, Sungam are attended in the seminar.



3.4. Training Programme on Camera Trap exercise

Tiger monitoring is one of the prime activities of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. The support of the field staff is essential to carry out this activity simultaneously over a large area. In order to develop the technical competency among the field staff and watchers in handling the camera traps and other tools used in the tiger monitoring, this one-day training programme was organised On 24 November 2022. In this programme, 70 members including staff and watchers participated. Aspects like methodology for collection of data from the field, use of equipment like GPS and camera traps were discussed. Dr. Balasubhramanyam, Lead tiger monitoring expert and Sri. Vishnu Vijayan, Conservation Biologist, PaTCoF was the resource person.



3.5. Chithrakala Training Workshop

Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation organised Chithrakala training workshop at Tiger Hall Parambikulam from May 15th to 18th. 60 Children between the ages of 8 to 18 from the four tribal colonies participated in the four-day training camp. Instructors Smt. Deepthi and Smt. Ajitha led the training session and they taught basic painting lessons, colour mixing, nature scenes, and still life painting techniques.



4. Awareness Campaigns and Outreach

4.1. Field Level Financial Literacy Event of Reserve Bank of India

Field level financial literacy event was organised by Reserve Bank of India, Lead Bank Palakkad and PaTCoF on February 3rd 2023 at Study Hall, Anappady. The program was inaugurated by Dr.Cedric Lawrence, General Manager, Reserve Bank of India, Kerala. Parambikulam Tiger Reserve Deputy Director R.Sujit, Revenue Divisional officer Smt. Amrithavalli D, Shri. R Shankar Narayan, General Manager, Reserve Bank of India , Staff from Parambikulam Tiger Reserve and people from different tribal colonies attended this event.

A class was given to the participants in the topic “Familiarization of Currency and Digitalization” by Lead Bank Palakkad. The participants got an opportunity to exchange the Old Currency with New one. PaTCoF, Reserve Bank of India and Lead Bank jointly distributed study materials to the children of Government Tribal LP School, Thekkady and distributed bags to the participants in the event. PaTCoF provided all the technical/professional support for the event.





4.2. Fire Awareness Campaign at Parambikulam Tiger Reserve

Fire awareness campaigns were conducted at Anappady during March 2023 in anticipation of the upcoming fire season. About 56 persons including forest officials, officials from other departments, naturalists, forest watchers and residents of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve participated in the program. The participants carried placards and banners depicting slogans regarding the importance of forest protection from wildfires.



4.3. International Day of Forest

International Day of Forests 2023 was celebrated by PaTCoF and Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. PaTCoF organised a class in Anappady study hall on the topic “ Biodiversity of Western Ghats” by Principal scientist of Kerala Forest Research Institute (KFRI) Dr.P.Sujanapal. The class was attended by forest staff, watchers and staff of the divisional office.



4.4. Global Tiger Day

On July 29th 2022, PaTCoF celebrated Global Tiger Day. To ensure that the slogans or motto of these important days reach the general public, an online competition was conducted by PaTCoF. The online event was a short video competition with the pre designated theme of conservation. Participants submitted their entries in relation to the topic. These videos were posted in our official Facebook/Instagram pages from 13th August 2022 to 18th August 2022 and it was evaluated based on the total number of likes it received from the public. The winners were awarded cash prize and certificate by PaTCoF.



4.5. Anti-Drug Awareness Class

An Anti-drug awareness class was conducted by PaTCoF in association with Kerala Excise Department and Kerala Police, Parambikulam on 20/12/2022 in study hall, Anappady. The Anti-Drug awareness campaign was inaugurated by

Sri.C.Ajayan, Range Officer, Parambikulam and the keynote address was given by Sri. K.Jayapalan, Deputy Commissioner of excise, Palakkad. Around 51 people participated in the awareness class including staff from Parambikulam Tiger Reserve, Kerala Police and peoples from different tribal colonies of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve.



4.6. Exposure visits

As of comparing the previous years, after the Covid 19 period, The number of visitors in the reserve increased as part of the study tour and exposure visits, Parambikulam Tiger Reserve had the following visitors during the reporting period. Technical/Professional inputs for these exposure visits were provided by the PaTCoF team.

5. Livelihood improvement activities

The Reserve is having 85 Sq.Km area under teak plantations raised since 1921 and people were getting continuous employment till 2000 in various plantation activities (planting, maintenance, thinning, final felling operations, loading and unloading). However, all the plantation activities were stopped from 2000 onwards that resulted in large-scale unemployment to native people and their dependence on forest resources was increased. The unemployment was overcome to a certain extent by community ecotourism. In order to achieve the objective of creating employment for atleast one member in a family, new self sustaining livelihood improvement activities are to be devised. Creation of Bamboo crafts manufacturing unit by association of different SHGs created under VDVK was envisaged and an initial training in this regard was organised by PaTCoF.

PaTCoF organised a 20 days training programme on Bamboo craft manufacturing from March 15 to March 25,2023 for VDVK members of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. The training programme was led by Namthang Bamboo Handicraft, North Sikkim. 35 VDVK members participated from Kuriarkutty, Kadavu and Earthdam Colony in the training workshop.



6. Healthcare of indigenous communities

Parambikulam Tiger Reserve and Karuna Medical College Jointly Organised a medical camp in Tiger Hall on May 31, 2022 by 10 medical staff under the leadership of Dr.Ramesh. Doctors from the Community Health, Ophthalmology, Gynecology, ENT associated with the medical camp and around 80 people were treated by the medical team.



Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation has organised medical camps from on 16.12.2022 to 18.12.2022 at Parambikulam for the residents of six tribal settlements in Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. The camp was led by the Doctors in the field of Orthopedics, Ophthalmology, ENT.



7. Ecotourism activities :

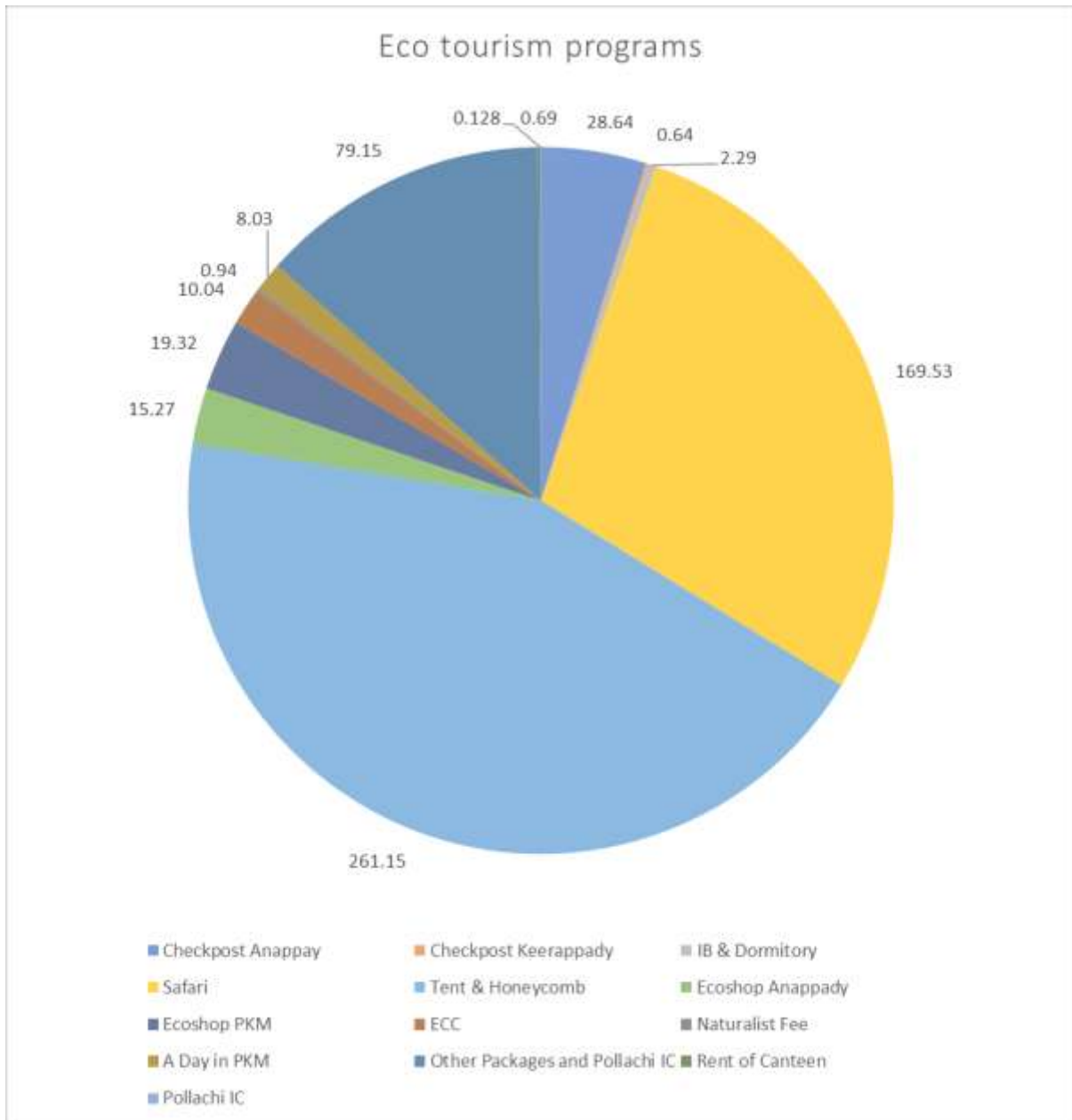
Community oriented ecotourism packages are the hall mark of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. These programmes are organized by the local tribals of various Eco Development Committees in Parambikulam Tiger Reserve. These programmes are oriented towards protection, nature education and awareness creation. The revenue generated from these programmes is recycled for the welfare of communities for their livelihood, health and education purposes. The various ecotourism packages are

Vehicle Safari, Tented Niche, Honey Comb Complex, Treetophut, Veettikunnu Island Nest, Peruvari Island Nest, Tribal Symphony, Bamboo Rafting, Trekking programmes, Day in Parambikulam etc.

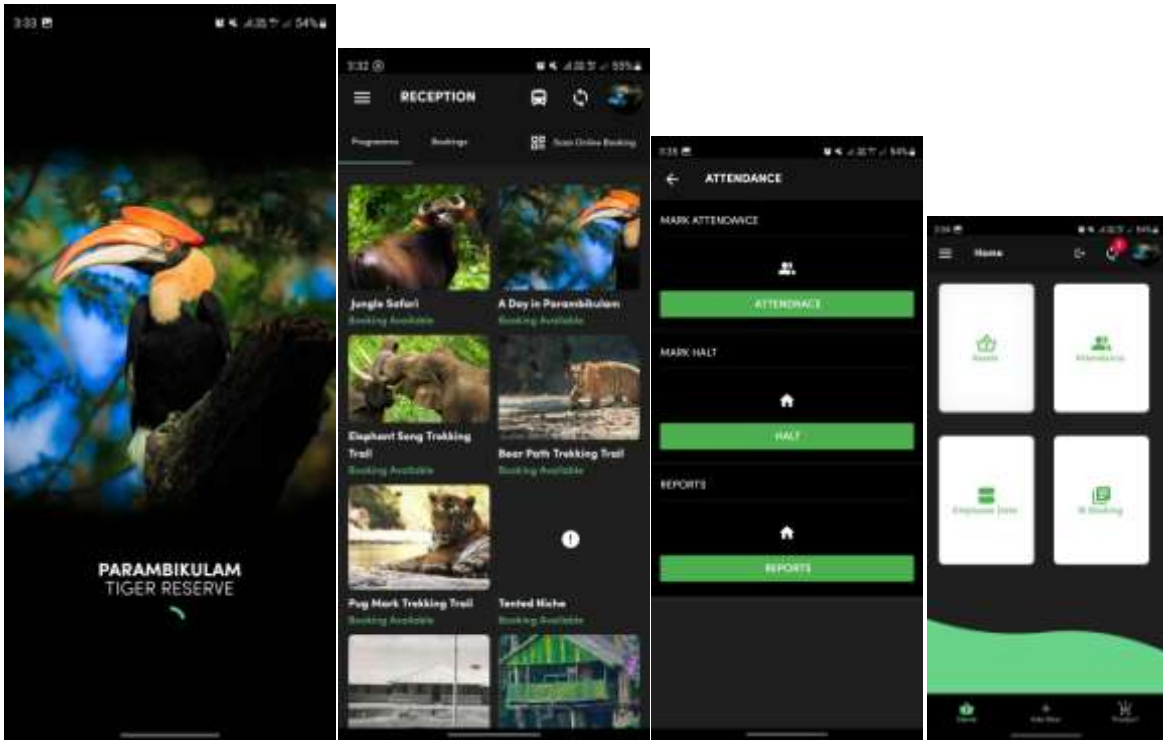

8. New initiatives

8.1. Mob app for Ecotourism management

8.2. Inauguration of the Second Coir Root Trainer Unit

PaTCof constructed a coir root trainer manufacturing unit at KWTIC Pollachi by using the Corporate Responsibility (CSR) fund of an organization. The unit was inaugurated during International Day of Forest Celebration in 2021 (21-03-2021). Fund (CSR) of GAIL, PaTCof was the first organisation from Kerala Forest Department to avail a

Since considering the huge requirement and already the department started procuring the coir root trainers from private vendors, Under CSR Initiatives of GAIL, PaTCof procure another machine with 8 unit capacity to increase the production capacity of the unit. This facility was expanded by adding a working area to sort the raw material, to flatten it out and prepare it for pressing under the moulding unit in order to produce the finished root trainers and a storage area was developed to store the raw material and finished product.

The second phase of the Coir root trainer unit was inaugurated on 24.06.2022 by Sri. L R Varma, General manager GAIL (India) Ltd. in the presence of the officials from GAIL (India) Ltd, Forest officers, Forest Watchers and people of Parambikulam.



8.3. Inauguration of the Tribal Heritage Centre at Parambikulam Tiger Reserve

The inauguration of the renovated Tribal Heritage centre took place on June 15, 2022, by Oorumooppan of Ancham Colony Prabhakaran in the presence of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve Deputy Director Sri. Vysakh Sasiskumar IFS, Parambikulam, Sungam, Orukomban, Karimala range officers, staff of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve, and the Public joined the function.

The history and life of the tribes residing in Parambikulam were exhibited in the tribal heritage centre. The utensils, objects and weapons picturized their history in the tribal heritage centre and gave information to the tourists about the tribes of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve.



8.4. Inauguration of the Renovated Vanasree EcoShop in Parambikulam.

The inauguration of the renovated Vanasree EcoShop took place on June 15, 2022, by Parambikulam Tiger Reserve Deputy Director Sri. Vysakh Sasiskumar IFS, Parambikulam, Sungam, Orukomban, Karimala range officers, staff of Parambikulam Tiger Reserve, and the Public joined the function.

9.2. Honouring the staffs of Coir root trainer for the best performance

Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation honored the staff of Coir Root Trainer Unit, KWLTIC, Pollachi for the best performance on the reporting year. The Unit has manufactured more than 7,00,000 numbers of Coir Root Trainers to be distributed to the Social Forestry Wing of Kerala Forest Department. They were given a cash prize of Rs. 50,000/- and Certificates.
